Or, use your social media account


2. Create password and type in your name.

Other attendees will see this and network with you, so make it look good. You can edit it later; click your profile picture (or a default headshot image) at top-left corner of the event “Home.”




Once downloaded, search for “IEEE International Symposium on Biomedical Imaging”. If you are a registered attendee, it should show up right away.

Right: This is what you can find in the Logistics section of the app. Browse more information about the key speakers, workshops, and more.




Browsing the Agenda:

The left screenshot shows what each day will look like – you can view the session names and times here. All presentations will be posted at one time (they will not be live), so you don’t necessarily have to watch them at the specific times.


We do encourage you to view the conference presentations during the dates of ISBI, April 3 – 7, so that you can interact with other attendees and have live discussions through the app.

The middle screenshot shows the paper listing within a session, and the right screenshot shows what a paper record will look like. It includes the list of authors and you can view the PDF paper within the app.

You can also comment on papers and “like” them if you enjoyed their talk. We encourage authors to visit their paper in the app to check if anyone asked questions, so there can still be a Q&A aspect to the virtual event.



Left: This is the Community Board, where you can create threads for topics you'd like to discuss with colleagues. We encourage you to create topics or groups based on your interests so you can connect with others.



Right: You can also browse the list of attendees, and see if there is anyone you are interested in connecting with. There is a message feature so that you can reach out and say hi.
